

News from the School Office

<u>School Hours</u>: School doors will open at 7:50 am. If your child(ren) are dropped off prior to 7:50 they will be brought to Daycare and they will be charged the drop-in daycare rate of \$6.00/hour.

Forms: Please make sure you have turned your emergency card and physicals. Every student must have an emergency card filled out in the office. We MUST have physicals for all preschool, kindergarten, 5th grade, new students and any middle school student who is or will be participating in sports. Current immunization cards are required for all students who have received a new shot in the past year.

Attendance: If your child is going to be absent or late for any reason please call the school office. You may reach the attendance line after hours by calling 970-667-7606, entering extension 4020 and leaving a message. In addition, you are welcome to contact the teacher via either email or phone. Attendance calls will be made to the home in the morning for any student who is absent and parent notification has not been received.

<u>Sign In/Out Process:</u> If you need to pick up your child during the school day, you will need to sign him/her OUT in the school office. If students come in late, they will need to be signed IN at the school office. Late arrivals will be given a slip that notifies teachers the student has signed

in. If someone else is picking up your child, please send a note giving written permission for them to do so.

Those under the age of 4 should visit their personal health care provider to receive vaccinations.

TERRACYCLE FOR ILS

Drink Pouch Brigade - *any brand* foil juice pouch, including the straw! Please drink all your juice or squeeze them out. Put these in the separate bins for juice pouches to keep the wet sticky stuff out of the dry stuff.

Chip/Snack Bag Brigade – *any size, any brand, any condition* empty chip, pretzel, or snack bag, including 100 calorie wrappers. This includes the larger plastic bag that held smaller snack sized bags of chips, bags of cracker jack, and any other chip, pretzel, or cracker bags.

Energy Bar Wrapper Brigade – *any brand*, *any condition foil* bar wrapper. Even Rice Krispie Treat and Pop Tart wrappers.

Candy Wrapper Brigade – *any size*, *any brand*, *any condition* candy wrappers and candy bags. This includes: Lindt truffle wrappers (but NOT foil wrappers), chocolate chip bags, Starburst wrappers (even the individual waxy type wrappers), tootsie roll, tootsie pop, dum dum, and any lollipop wrappers. NOT ACCEPTED: any tin foil type of wrappers, including Hershey kisses, any fruit snack or fruit roll-up type wrappers, including Welch's fruit snacks, marshmallow bags.

New Accepted Items! - Dairy Tub Brigade - wash, dry and turn in *any size*, *any brand dairy product container and lid*. This includes grated/shredded cheese, yogurt, margarine/butter spreads, cream cheese, sour cream, cottage cheese spreads, etc.

Cheese Packaging Brigade – any size, any brand cheese bag or wrapper.

Malt-O-Meal® Cereal Bag Brigade – *any size*, *any brand* cereal bag from cereals that come only in a bag. NO cereal bags that come inside a cereal box.

NEW! - **Hot Cereal Brigade** – *any brand* hot cereal pouch.

Tortilla and Tostada Bag Brigade – any size, any brand tortilla or tostada bag.

Bear Naked Brigade - any Bear Naked brand packaging.

NEW! - Athenos Packaging Brigade – *only Athenos brand* packaging, clean and dry, please!

NEW! - Wine Pouch Brigade – *any brand* wine pouch, you can recycle corks with us, too! (Corks don't earn cash but make great craft supplies.)

NEW! - Sprout Baby Food Pouch Brigade – *only Sprout brand* at this time.

GoGo squeeZ Brigade – GoGo squeeZ snack pouches and *any brand* healthy snack pouch plastic packaging, sealed with the caps please!

Scotch Tape Brigade – any size, any brand plastic tape dispensers and cores.

Elmer's Glue Crew Brigade - RINSE and dry, then turn in only Elmer's brand glue bottles and glue sticks.

Writing Instruments Brigade – *any brand* pens, regular pencils, mechanical pencils, markers, & highlighters, and even Crayola twistable crayons. Terracycle does not accept regular waxy crayons, but if you do not upcycle them at home, please turn them in for use at school.

Personal Care and Beauty Brigade - *any brand, any type* of personal care/beauty packaging. Examples include lotions, sun tan lotion, face wash, body wash, lipstick, mascara, makeup *cases*, shampoo and conditioner *bottles and tubes*, etc. Please *clean them out* as best you can and *seal them* to not leak! NO hair spray or sunscreen spray cans, no nail polish bottles, or nail polish remover bottles.

Colgate Oral Care Brigade – *any brand* of oral care products, including any kind of toothbrush, empty toothpaste tubes, empty denture cleaners / adhesive tubes (such as Fixodent) and the plastic packaging that toothbrushes come in. We will not accept: the cardboard packaging most toothpaste tubes are sold in (these are typically recyclable) and Crest White Strips foil packets.

Huggies® Brand Brigade - plastic outer packaging from *any brand* diapers, pull-ups, wipes, or other diaper/personal products.

NEW! - Cleaner Packaging Brigade – *any brand* cleaning products packaging including pump/trigger top/lids, wipes containers, wipes pouches, and other flexible packaging from cleaning products.

Various Electronics Brigades – cell phones, MP3 players, keyboard, mice, laptops, GPS units, and digital cameras can be recycled for \$0.02 to \$5.00, depending on the item. You can also teracycle plastic electronic packaging!

NO LONGER ACCEPTED! – Scott Paper Product Packaging, Cookie Packaging, Coffee Bag, and Kashi Packaging Brigades. (Many Kashi items are still accepted with other brigades, but not cardboard.)

Any sorting you do with what you collect at home is a *big help* to our parent volunteers. For example, stuff all the chip/snack bags inside one chip bag, all the bar wrappers in a clean/dry Ziploc or shopping bag, all the candy wrappers in another bag, all the tortilla bags in one tortilla bag, and so on.

Recycle Caps with Aveda

Currently caps are not acceptable recycling in most local recycle bins (visit the Garbage Garage at the Larimer County Landfill for more information). The Recycle Caps with Aveda program accepts caps that are rigid polypropylene plastic, sometimes noted with a 5 in the chasing arrows recycling symbol. This includes caps that twist on with a threaded neck such as caps on, water, soda, milk and other beverage bottles, flip top caps on tubes and food product bottles (such as ketchup and mayonnaise), laundry detergents and some jar lids such as peanut butter. Excluded from collection are pharmaceutical lids and non rigid lids such as yogurt lids, tub lids (margarine, cottage cheese), and screw on lids that are not rigid. Please do not include any metal lids or plastic pumps or sprayers. See http://www.aveda.com/aboutaveda/caps.tmpl?ngextredir=1 for more information.

Turn in clean accepted caps with your Terracycling in the burgundy collection bins. Please keep them separate from the Morning Fresh Dairy caps in the black collection cubbies. At lunch and sporting events, caps from drinks can also be deposited in the white juice pouch collection bin.
